RESEARCHERS' TEST, 2022

RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. GENERAL

- (i) Only those students those who have registered and whose registrations have been received by the Moot Court Society ("MCS") for the Researchers' Test, 2022, shall be eligible to give the test.
- (ii) The scores of any person who has not registered and still attempts the Test, shall not be taken into consideration.
- (iii) An Intra Researchers' List shall be generated on the basis of the scores received by the participant in the test.
- (iv) The Researchers' List shall be applicable for the academic year of 2022-23 only. In case of any exigencies, this duration shall be extended at the discretion of the MCS.

B. PLATFORM

- (i) The Test shall be conducted in two batches on 8th August, 2022. Slot 1 shall be from 11:00 AM – 11:20 AM and Slot 2 shall be from 11:30 AM – 11:50 AM.
- (ii) The test will be carried out in College in the Computer Lab. Participants must sit in the Computer Lab on the Personal Computer (PC) Number designated to them. The allotment list shall be shared on 7th August, 2022.
- (iii) The Test will be displayed on your computer screen designated to you.
- (iv) Students in Slot 1 shall assemble in Room Number 4 by 10:40 AM and students in Slot 2 shall assemble in Room Number 4 by 11:10 AM.

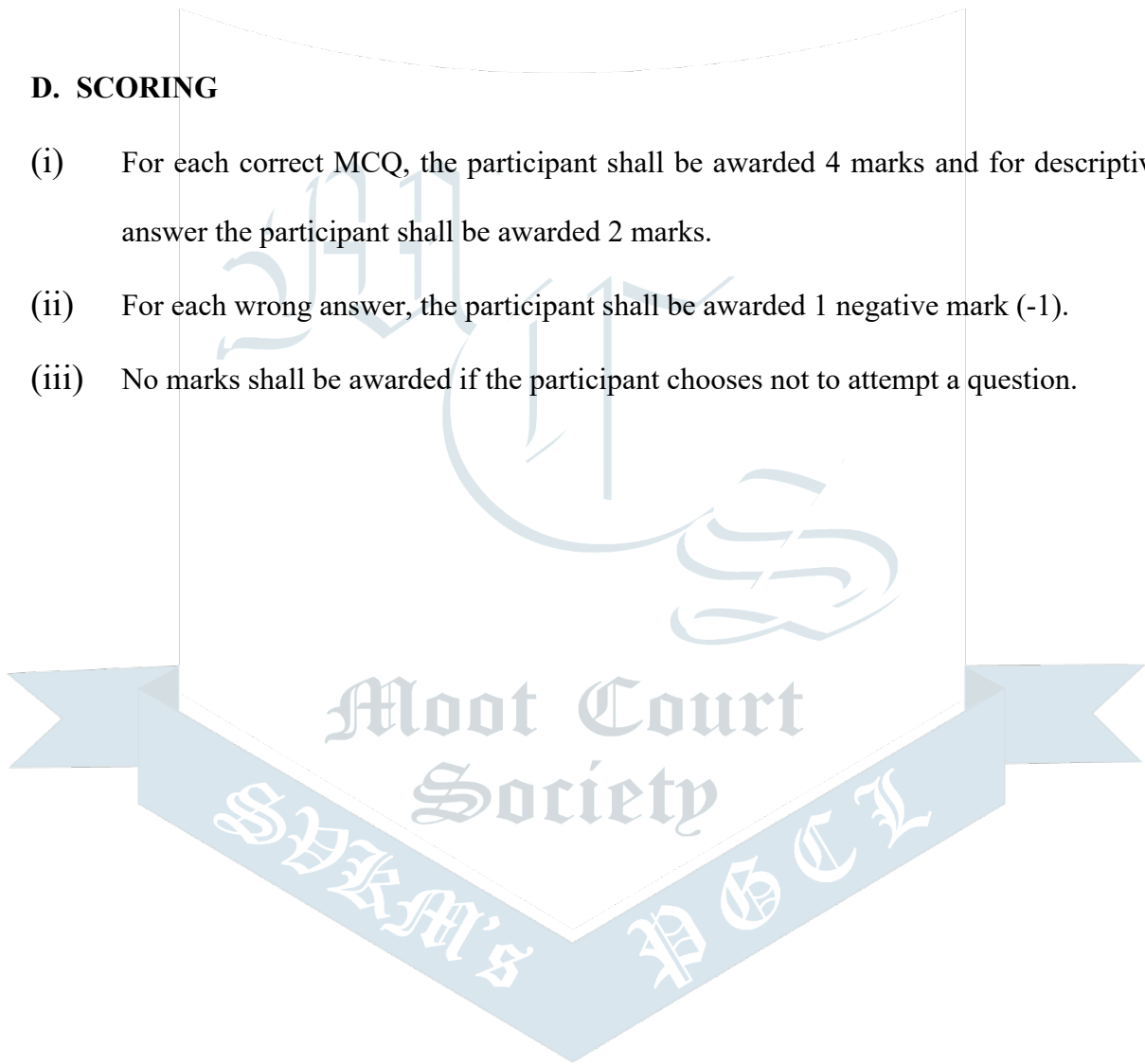


C. CONTENT

- (i) Participants shall attempt a total of 40 questions in a duration of 20 minutes only.
- (ii) The questions in the test would be Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) as well as descriptive format.
- (iii) The questions for the test would be based on, inter alia, the facts and the legal principles used in the moot proposition, the articles/sections used in the proposition, landmark judgements based on these articles/sections, application-based questions, legal maxims, general knowledge, current affairs, etc.

D. SCORING

- (i) For each correct MCQ, the participant shall be awarded 4 marks and for descriptive answer the participant shall be awarded 2 marks.
- (ii) For each wrong answer, the participant shall be awarded 1 negative mark (-1).
- (iii) No marks shall be awarded if the participant chooses not to attempt a question.
